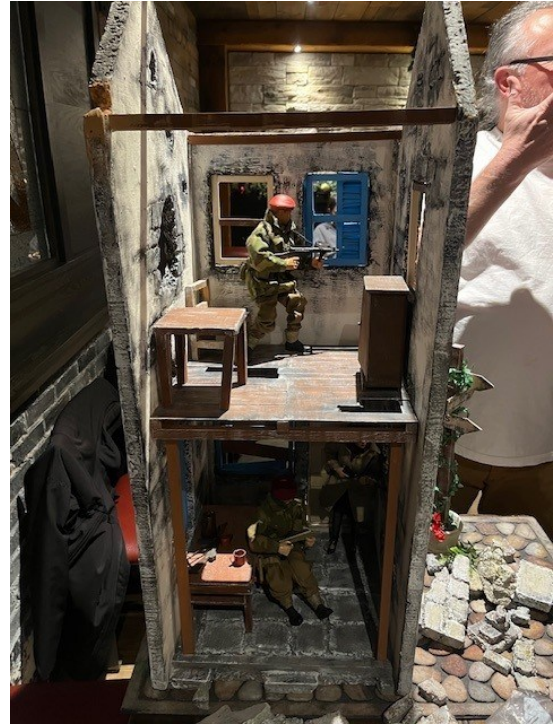
November 25 Ottawa Chapter Meeting

Movie Review — Nuremberg

Nuremberg is a 2025 American psychological thriller historical drama film written, co-produced, and directed by James Vanderbilt. It is based on the 2013 book *The Nazi and the Psychiatrist* by Jack El-Hai. In *Nuremberg*, psychiatrist Douglas Kelley (Rami Malek) is challenged with determining if Hermann Göring (Russell Crowe) is fit to stand trial at the Nuremberg trials. Leo Woodall, John Slattery, Mark O'Brien, Colin Hanks, Wrenn Schmidt, Lydia Peckham, Richard E. Grant, and Michael Shannon have supporting roles in the film.

The film had its world premiere in the Gala Presentations section of the Toronto International Film Festival on September 7, 2025, where it received a four-minute standing ovation, one of TIFF's longest standing ovations ever. It was released theatrically in the United States by Sony Pictures Classics on November 7, 2025. The film received generally positive reviews from critics, with particular praise for Crowe's performance.

Walking in Footsteps of the past

My recent trip to Europe involved visits to Athens and Rome, where after waiting for many years, I fulfilled my dream of visiting several ancient sites.

Rome is a world-class city and never fails to disappoint the visitor who can gaze at the buildings and monuments in awe of the achievements of the Roman Empire and more. My wife, Marie and I spent a few days in the city where the highlight of our stay was the tour of the Colosseum and the Roman Forum. To walk in the footsteps of the ancient Romans is so surreal and renders one in amazement.



The Colosseum's history began around 70-72 AD when Emperor Vespasian commissioned its construction in Rome as a gift to the Roman people, built on the site of Nero's former palace. Its construction was completed by his son, Titus, in 80 AD and officially opened with 100 days of games, including gladiatorial contests and animal hunts. Originally called the Flavius Amphitheatre, the name "Colosseum" likely came from a nearby colossal statue of Nero. It was used for public spectacles for over four centuries.

The Roman Forum, or Forum Romanum, is an ancient archaeological site in the centre of Rome that was the heart of public life for centuries, serving as a hub for political, religious, and social activities. Today, it is a rectangular plaza surrounded by the ruins of important government buildings, temples, and monuments, located between the Capitoline and Palatine Hills and near the Colosseum. It is a key site for understanding the Roman Empire, and visitors can see remnants of its grand past, including the Via Sacra, the Arch of Titus, and the ruins of temples such as Saturn and Vesta.

Many years ago, my father gave me his WW2 photo album packed with memorable shots that were taken with his Brownie camera which he purchased in Jerusalem in 1942. One photo of special interest was taken in 1944 shortly after the liberation of Rome by the Allies. My father served in the Polish army and was attached to the artillery division Polish Second Corps. In the photograph he is standing on his truck with a comrade in the back of the vehicle. While in Rome we searched for the exact spot where he posed for the photographer. There in front of the Roman Forum and to the left of the Victor Emmanuel II monument I made my discovery. I had promised myself to honour my father by literally following in his footsteps, albeit for a few yards, so mission accomplished.

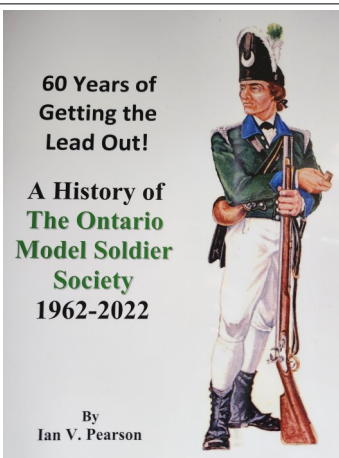
